MESSAGE FROM THE SECRETARY-TREASURER



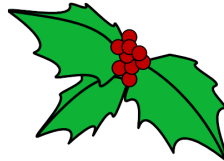
Dear Colleagues,

Just a reminder, the next Plant Canada Conference will take place in Halifax, Nova Scotia, July 17-21, 2011. The conference is organized by CSA, CSHS, CSPP, CBA, CPS & CWSS. Under the title "Plant Adaptation to Environmental Change" a wide variety of subject will be presented and discussed.

As there are many researchers working on organic projects in horticulture, the Conference will have a joint session with Organic Agriculture Centre of Canada (OACC). It is still in planning stages but it looks that this session will take place on Thursday, July 21, 2011 on the same day the joint session with CIFST is taking place in the morning. The Plant Canada 2011 organizers are also working on: 1) broadening the scope of organic to sustainable, 2) accommodating the Plant Health aspects, and 3) integrating CSHS's program with the Canadian Institute of Food Technology (which in fact will partially be done if more emphasis will be

put on plants and human health). Also, following a suggestion of Dr. David Percival, organizers are considering to include sustainable urban horticulture initiative that is presently being offered at Dalhousie University, Halifax. The program is lead by Dr. Deborah Buzzard. Combined with the environmental horticulture program at Nova Scotia Agricultural College (NSAC) and the Nova Scotia Community College's urban horticulture program, this could be a valuable source of new CSHS members.

POST DOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP at MCGILL UNIVERSITY

Title: McGill University Postdoctoral Fellowship in Sustainable Agriculture – 2011

Location: Faculty of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences, Macdonald Campus, McGill University, 21,111 Lakeshore, Ste. Anne de Bellevue, Quebec, Canada H9X 3V9

Description: Applications are now being accepted for a 2-year fellowship, valued at CDN\$35,000 per year, tenable in the Faculty of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences, Macdonald Campus, McGill University. *The competition is intended for new incoming candidates to the university.* The successful candidate will conduct postdoctoral research in the area of sustainable agriculture under the supervision of a professor in one of the Faculty's academic units. The proposed research would address themes such as food quality and safety, nutrition and health, biosciences, bio-products and biotechnology, bio-resource and environmental engineering, conservation and the environment. Eligibility: Candidates must have completed their PhD within three years prior to commencement of the award.

Application Deadline: March 1, 2011 (*in the event that March 1 falls on a weekend, the deadline will be the following working day*), for tenure not prior to September, 1, 2011. All applicants will be contacted not later than June 1, 2011.

The following application materials are required and may be submitted by electronic mail, by fax or by postal mail" to meet the deadline:

Checklist:

- A letter of application from the candidate, including a statement of research interests for the period of the fellowship (*maximum 2 pages*) and an indication of when he/she expects to be available to take up the award if successful. This letter should briefly outline the facilities required to undertake the research and the name of a suitable supervisor in the Faculty of Agricultural and Environmental Science whose research program falls within the interest of the candidate www.mcgill.ca/macdonald/units;
- A statement of support from the proposed supervisor;
- The candidate's curriculum vitae *including a current e-mail address*;
- Names and current e-mail addresses of two individuals who have agreed to provide letters of reference (these are in addition to the statement of support from the proposed supervisor);
- Two letters of reference, sent directly by the referees (in addition to the statement of support from the proposed supervisor). Letters must reach the Student Affairs Office no later than

January 3, 2011.

- University-level transcripts. These may be official transcripts sent directly by the university or universities, or unofficial transcripts sent by the candidate.

Please note: THERE IS NO APPLICATION FORM!

Applications will be considered based on the academic merit and research potential of the candidates and the Faculty's ability to accommodate the proposed research. Travel expenses, insurance, immigration fees, etc., will be the responsibility of the fellowship holder. There is no citizenship restriction. Following its initial consideration based on the documents listed above, the Faculty may request additional information or documents (e.g. official transcripts, original letters) from short-listed candidates, their universities, and/or their references. NSAC AWARDED CANADA RESEARCH CHAIR, TRURO, NS

NSAC awarded Canada Research Chair valued at \$500,000

Bible Hill, November 29, 2010 -- Research excellence at NSAC (Nova Scotia Agricultural College, Truro, NS) was awarded with the presentation of a Canada Research Chair valued at \$500,000 to the Bible Hill University. Dr. Vasantha Rupasinghe received a Tier II Canada Research Chair in fruit biochemistry and bioproducts valued at \$100,000 annually for the duration of the term. Tier II Chair positions are tenable for five years and renewable once and are intended for exceptional emerging researchers, acknowledged by their peers as having the potential to lead in their field.

"NSAC is proud to be part of the Canada Research Chairs program and in particular of Dr. Rupasinghe and his leading-edge research," said Dr. Richard Donald, NSAC vice president, research, extension and outreach. "Dr. Rupasinghe's research is a key component of NSAC's research program and contributes greatly to our ability to support, healthy, sustainable communities."

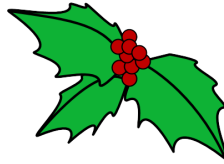
Dr. Rupasinghe's research involves developing and commercializing innovative, socially and economically acceptable value-added foods, food additives and ingredients, natural health products and other bioproducts from cool climate fruits. Increased consumption of fruits and vegetables as well as the use of novel food ingredients derived from fruits and vegetables will be important in helping to manage current and emerging health care challenges.

"Less in the abundance though they are, some non-nutrient components in fruits such as polyphenolics have remarkable power in promoting human health and wellness," said Dr. Rupasinghe.

Research will be expanded to identify unique antioxidant compounds of fruits that can play a major role in reducing the risk of chronic diseases like brain disorders and heart disease. The new funds will allow Dr. Rupasinghe to explore the processes of isolating these valuable components from under-utilized fruit bio-resources in Atlantic Canada and then to develop novel bio-products.

NSAC holds three prestigious Canada Research Chairs - one in agricultural biotechnology, one in organic agriculture and currently fruit biochemistry and bio-products. NSAC is a specialized university

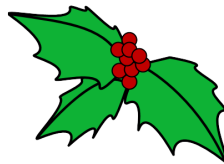

SOIL AMENDMENT PROGRAM, Nova Scotia

Farm Focus, December 16, 2010

Nova Scotia is investing \$400,000 for the Soil Amendment Program, Agriculture Minister John MacDonell said Nov. 25, at the NS Federation of Agriculture annual meeting in Truro.

The new funding will assist farmers to transport lime and wood ash to their land to help with soil fertility, volume, moisture retention and pH balance.

"Keeping lands productive is important, but it can be cost-prohibitive for farmers to transport substances like lime to individual farms," said NSFA President Richard Melvin. "We welcome new funding for a soil amendment program and are grateful that the minister shares our concerns regarding the importance of improving soils on Nova Scotia farms."

Growers can apply to the Department of Agriculture for assistance in the spring.

Seed Germination, December 16, 2010

Two Western Canadian companies have teamed up to provide canola growers a new seed-applied fertilizer option for enhanced early plant growth. Canterra Seeds is offering Protinus, a seed-applied fertilizer developed by Wolf Trax that is designed to enhance early seedling growth, on two canola hybrids for the 2011 growing season. Innovotech Inc., which specializes in biofilm product development, has secured additional funding of \$154,000 for Agress, its environmentally friendly seed treatment and plant spray designed to protect crops against both bacterial and fungal infections. The two year funding from Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada's Growing Canadian Agri-Innovations Program will be governed by the Pulse Crops (Canada) Association and will focus on the improvement of dry bean yield, disease resistance and seed quality. According to a recent article published in the *Vancouver Sun*, producers in Western Canada are scrambling to find good planting seed for next year. "The wet growing season that downgraded crops has also taken a toll on the quality of available seed. Bruce Carriere of Discovery Seeds in Saskatoon says in his 19 years in the seed testing business, he's never seen anything quite so ugly as this year. Germination and vigour are low; disease is high. On wheat, the lab is seeing the highest fusarium counts ever, even in western parts of the Prairie region that aren't noted for the disease," says the article. For more information, click [here](#).

The Government of Canada has highlighted its commitment to renewable fuels. Federal regulations requiring five per cent renewable fuel content in gasoline came into effect on December 15, 2010. These regulations are one pillar of the Government's broader Renewable Fuels Strategy. The Strategy will establish a demand for renewable fuels that will help stimulate Canadian biofuel production, create jobs and new market opportunities for farmers, and help create jobs in rural communities, while accelerating the commercialization of new biofuel technologies.
